

E911 Compliance Assessment

As of February 2022, Kari's Law and Ray Baum's Act are in full effect. These impose critical requirements of your Teams calling system - are you ready?

What Does This Mean?

Federal law now requires a dispatchable location, which is the place a person is calling from – not just the address. This includes things like floor level, warehouse location, and other easily identifiable information to help first responders get there fast.

In addition to the phone call reaching emergency services without having to dial a prefix, a notification must be sent to your organization that an emergency call has been placed. The notification must include information about the caller (and a valid callback number) as well as their location.

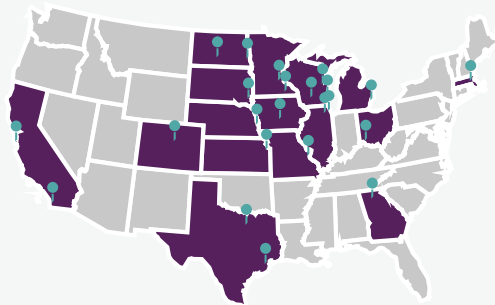
Assess Your Environment
