Human trafficking is a public health crisis impacting over 1.1 million individuals across the United States. And yet, less than 1% of victims are currently identified. **Healthcare professionals (HCPs) have perhaps the most critical role to play** in recognizing and responding to human trafficking in local communities. In the United States, up to **90% of human trafficking victims present themselves to healthcare settings**, many between 15-18x, during the time of their exploitation without being properly identified, and as a result, continue to be trafficked. Survivors report on average more than 10 concurrent physical, sexual, and mental health issues.

Their message to us is clear: both victims and survivors of human trafficking **desperately need healthcare professionals to get equipped** to identify, intervene, care for, and even prevent human trafficking in our communities.

- Recognize key indicators and how these might appear in a healthcare setting.
- Describe how to report suspected human trafficking as a healthcare professional.
- Describe challenges that can arise when working to end human trafficking.
- Recognize the role of key organizations and agencies working to address human trafficking, and ways members of a healthcare team can work together to address human trafficking.


